This email responds to your request for public records made on October 7, 2020 on the City of Pleasanton's GovQA portal. Thank you for agreeing to extend the City's response date to October 30, 2020.

You requested records "relevant to the decision making process to operate on credible threats of looting to close 5 entrances leading to Stoneridge Mall for Sunday May 31st 2020 and Monday June 1st 2020 including records but not limited to" enumerated categories. The City's response to each follows:

1. Emails, meeting notes, internal correspondence, inter-agency correspondence, and public releases related to credible threats of looting for the time period of Sunday May 31st, 2020 and Monday June 1st 2020.

Response: There are records but they are exempt from disclosure pursuant to Government Code sections 6254(f) and (k) and Evidence Code section 1040.

2. Emails, meeting notes, internal correspondence, inter-agency correspondence, public releases, and correspondence with companies related to the decision to close entrances around Stoneridge Mall.

Response: No responsive records.

3. After action reports, incident reports, Special Event Threat Assessment (SETA) Reports, and any other reports on the protests and looting in the Tri-Valley Area for the time period of May 31st 2020 and June 1st 2020.


Response: No responsive records.
